Instructor: Louise Smith has been a technology teacher for many years in libraries throughout the Pioneer Library System. This course is funded by the Ontario County Office for the Aging with funding from the New York State Office for the Aging. *Note: There is already a long waiting list from Spring 2008 so space is very limited. If space is unavailable, you may be put on the waiting list for Spring 2009 classes.*
